Hello everyone my name is Brandon Sam, I'm a Native American (Navajo) from the reservation outside of Gallup, NM.

I came here because of my past issues with drugs and alcohol and all other sorts of things. I was a very bad alcoholic and drug abuser, so I decided to change my ways to better myself.

I wish to be better and a better father for my kids. I have four daughters and five step kids whom I love. I have a wonderful lady that I intend to marry one day, but first I need to work on getting myself back on track.



I came down to the Mesilla Valley Hospital for rehab from my drug and alcohol habits as well as some depression that was bothering me. I was there for a month or so getting myself clean. When I was released, I was brought to the mission where I have stayed and remain sober.

The Mission has helped me out a lot, by this I mean they have helped me to stay focused on what I

need in life. They let you attend chapel here and I never used to believe in God or tried to find out who he was.

After a while, I decided to take that step and invite the Lord into my life and heart, and that is when everything began falling into place for me. I love attending service now because He helped me believe that I can be a better father for my kids, and a better man for my lady.

Being here in Las Cruces has really changed my life, I became clean and sober and invited God into my life. I'm letting everyone who is reading this that if you want to change your life for the better, you can.
