All donations are once again being received if they are in good condition (no stains, holes or excessive wear).

- Warm Clothing: Pants, Jackets, Beanies & Scarves
- Blankets & Sleeping Bags
- Underwear & Socks

- Hand Sanitizer (60% alcohol)
- Disposable germ-killing wipes

In planning for the future, the mission is always trying to find ways that will improve our overall impact on the homeless population.

The two buildings that are on the front of our property are very old and have come near the end of functional usefulness.

For that reason, it may be better for future planning to consider taking them down and replacing them with a two story building with a larger footprint.

At this time, we are not ready to list the possible uses of the building, but we would like feedback from you. Our desire is to have a building with appealing design features to complement the look and image of the mission property.

Bible Studies at the Mission

The response from our current residents concerning the twice a week Bible studies has been very good. They are participating in discussion and answering questions that are asked by the speaker. It seems that the overall interest in the Bible has increased with a smaller group and an atmosphere that is not judgmental even when they may not grasp the full meaning of the text. We are seeing better attitudes and a closer knit group during these times when most people want to get away from home to do something.
