A New Year Has Arrived

We all know that 2020 was the most different and difficult year that many of us have seen in our lives. The good news is that through your help (prayers, donations, and volunteers), we have had a good year for our finances. Because of the things that have occurred during 2020, we are looking at ways to meet the changing needs of future residents. I will talk about a few of these changes in the rest of this article.

One of the first changes deals with the clothing donations. First and foremost, we don't want to throw away donation; therefore, let me explain how we handle the clothes. Everything that comes in is sorted: the clothes that can be sold (to provide funds needed for residents and overhead expenses) are sent to the Rock of Ages Thrift Store at 1420 S. Solano; the second group is placed in our clothing room at the shelter or taken to our free give away clothing room on Hadley; the last group up to now has been put in a trailer that will be picked up and shipped overseas to very poor nations. The industry is now changing and we will be forced to find a new way to handle the third group of clothing. The best answer is to buy a large bailer for the clothing and a forklift to move and load these large bails on a truck. This will provide a larger revenue stream and we will not throw anything away.

A second concern is how to meet the changing needs in the homeless community. COVID has changed all of society which includes the homeless. We are now receiving more phone calls from regular hospitals across the state as well as calls from hospitals that deal with mental (nonviolent) patients who have no place to go. We will start a building fund for a future expansion of our current shelter for a way to help some of these people. The Mission can't meet the needs of the entire homeless population, but we want to provide help to those who are ready to change their lives at a faith based facility which will address their spiritual, mental, emotional, and physical needs.

Some of the other changes will brought out later or in one or two sentences with pictures on the back page. We love and appreciate all of our donors and volunteers. Let us work together for a great year in 2021.

This will make the campus safer for everyone even after the pandemic is over.


Work project: Parking
