Demolition Of The Old Building

Our demolition of the old building is finally done! That part of the property now appears to be much larger, and we are anticipating the start of the next step in building.

That step is the dirt work including raising it to a level just above the driveway and compacting it for the foundation preparation.

When that is done, the utilities can be put in and the slab can be poured. That will cure until the buildings are delivered and erected in the spring of 2022.

From this point forward, I will not give real names or photos in consideration of the safety of our residents.

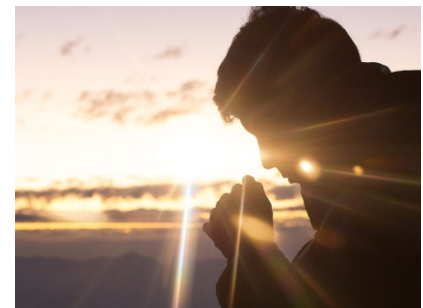
This story is about a resident who is an exception rather than the rule. They had a job and a place to live when something happened that changed everything.

House of Mercy project

Our House of Mercy project is now moving along quite well. This is the name we have chosen for our buildings after the completion of the demolition portion.

We will be adjusting for added costs and things that had not been considered by us or the city. It is our desire to provide the best possible construction with the amount of money that we have available. A new watering system will be installed for the landscaping, compacting of the fill dirt to raise the foundations of the new buildings out of low area, and the infrastructure will be built into to slabs of the two new buildings in order to have everything ready when the buildings arrive next spring.

Hopefully we will have a new look at the mission by next summer.
