COVID Care

The Mission has truly been blessed due to an excellent staff and residents who are aware of the Covid precautions.

We have always cleaned well, but due to situations for almost two years, we have become experts at cleaning and sanitizing.

The results that have come from these efforts have been fantastic. Even with new intakes daily, we have had very few cases of Covid among our residents.

Staff would take them to medical appointments, pickup their prescriptions and take care of other needs for the residents.

We are now allowing them to do most of these things for themselves even while keeping the cleaning protocol at an elevated level.



Resident Report

Recently a new resident was brought to us by their parent.

The situation at home was tenuous and we were willing to provide a safe environment for them during an interim period.

In talking to the individual, I discovered that drugs had become one of the problems in the situation.

We were here and tried to help in finding work to pay off debts while giving counsel about the use of drugs.

The person responded and did well. I had even told them that they could stay here as long as needed to get settled into a more productive manner of coping with life problems.

As other people had in the past, they decided to leave when the first apartment became open.

I will probably see them again in a few weeks or months.



Second Resident Report

A man came to us almost two years ago because he had nothing and no place to stay. This was the first time he had been to New Mexico and he “wanted to see what things were like here.”

He has been here at the Mission since that day working in various jobs around campus.

He has a variety of skills which enables him to be flexible for tasks that we ask him to do.

He has now at the point where he has earned the privilege of having a private room and quiet area for the select few who go above and beyond what we expect of them.

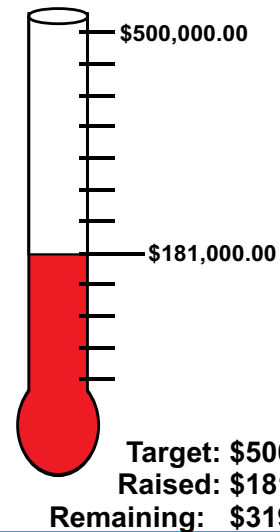
