House of Mercy Project

This is a direct approach to show love and kindness to the homeless who do not reside with us at the Mission. It is our desire to help as many as we have the resources to take care of their needs. We will provide food for them three times a day all year, and we can provide bedding for proper times of the year. At some point, we may provide other perks in this 30 by 50 foot building. The entire population of Las Cruces needs to go by The Rock of Ages Thrift Store at 1420 S. Solano and also go by our FREE clothing room at 1760 W. Hadley. The clothing room is open Monday/Wednesday/Friday from 10:00 am-11:30am and Wednesday 3pm-4:30pm.

I would now like to make you aware of the tremendous cost of the project. With all of the supply chain problems, the increased costs of fuel and labor increases, this project has risen from around \$500,00 to an a blotted figure between \$800,000 and \$1,000,000. The first thing that will ask from each of you is to pray about the funding shortages, and the second is to donate to the House of Mercy Project through the web site www.lcgrm.org or mail us a check to P.O. Box 386 Las Cruces, NM 88004. A third step would be to let as many friends and family know about this need whether they live here or anywhere else. We need to raise the additional \$350,000 with designated funds as well as our normal expenses of \$50,000 to \$60,000 thousand each month. We also could use a grant writer for this, and others have suggested estate donations for the project.

The second part of this story is concerning our ground breaking publicity. We would like to invite all to come to the Mission (1050 W. Amador) on May 11th at 9:30 am. We are inviting several different parties to join us in the adventure. May God bless each and every one of you who will read this. We look forward to meeting new people and reconnecting with old friends.

Your Invited – Monthly Lunch for Mission Ambassadors!

The second Tuesday of each month is the Mission Ambassadors lunch (first timers are FREE). Each month we gather in a room at La Posta to hear briefly (15-20min) about a different aspect of the Mission. This might be a first-hand testimony of someone that has been helped by the Mission, staff describing details of one of their many services, partner organizations telling how they work together.

It is a very informal process to become a Mission Ambassador... Just have a desire to share positive information about the Mission, dispel misconceptions, help people, etc. You determine your level of involvement. Maybe you just want to learn more, to be able to share (when the topic comes up), with your friends and family about services for poor and homeless in our community. Maybe you would invite a friend to the monthly lunches. Maybe you would choose to get more involved in the many volunteer opportunities in Ambassadors, or in the many Mission operations, or even street outreach to those in need. Maybe you want to help raise funding that allows the people on the front lines to operate every day.

Whatever the level of involvement, we can equip you with the information and contacts to answer the common questions and make informed referrals.


Clothing Room
