

What happens daily at the Mission? **Henry Young**

Each morning the lights are turned on and everyone gets out of bed, dresses, does their daily chores, and goes to breakfast. At 8:00 am, Monday through Friday, we have voluntary prayer time in the chapel for half an hour. This is followed at 8:30 by a mandatory meeting (Monday) only), Tuesday through Thursday it is a Bible study, and on Friday we have Celebrate Recovery.

After that early start, those that have paying jobs either go to work or have left earlier. The rest of the guests do four hours of work each day (one day off), and if they have been consistent on doing their hours each day they may sign out for a designated destination. The destination is needed in case something happens so we would know where to look for them.

They have three meals a day at the mission, so we serve three meals a day to the homeless who do not stay on campus. Guests are also

offered life skill and job skill training, case management, and help in acquiring a GED. Select staff and guests can get help for food handling or kitchen manager certification. One staff member is taking degree classes

for future work in mission or related services.

As the day draws to a close, both the men and women have common areas where they can enjoy snacks and various activities between 5:00 and 8:30 pm. Then they can go to bed early or wait until 10:00 pm for lights out. The mission averages 15 evening Chapel services each month, and we have 2 or 3 churches that provide transportation for services each week.

We also strive to form bridges with other entities in order to better serve the homeless of our community and make more people aware of what we do at the Las Cruces Gospel Rescue Mission.
