

The Las Cruces Gospel Rescue Mission is proud and thrilled to announce that after large efforts, great collaborations and partnership with Crosstown, we have produced a location for : **THE CLOTHING BARN**

First, a look back at this ministry. The Gospel Rescue Mission had a clothing room. It was operated by a beautiful and diligent woman, Wylene Saunders and her very dedicated team. This clothing room served the public by being open three times a week. They were able to resource clothing to approximately 70+ people/week. Sadly, a recent increase in costs made operation of the clothing room prohibitive for the Mission, and it had to be closed. However, the board saw fit to keep the ministry functioning. The clothing was transitioned to a small apartment and partnerships were born. Over these past months we have distributed clothing to 12 non-profits, 6 churches and 2 schools. On average we have

been able to resource 50 people/ week. The NEW "Clothing Barn" will be operated solely in a volunteer capacity so that the mission will not have an added expense. The clothing will be distributed for free. Having this barn will allow us to expand the partnerships to all non-profits, schools, and churches as we connect, as well as social media connections for access to the clothing.

No, it is still not yet accessible to the public. However, it is our hope that Wylene can still have a clothing room in town to serve the public directly. This connection can help the room operate in a more sustainable way. For example, the off-season clothing can be stored at the barn until needed without

having to use space in the public room. Also, clothing that is not being selected can be cycled to have items more likely to be selected

How did this barn come about?? Glad you asked. The old apple barn belongs to the Jaquess family. They have generously allowed us to store and distribute clothing from this location. The name Jaquess may ring a bell for some. Jerry Jaquess, together with Bill Wheeler, Frances Burke, and George Stafford began the Gospel Rescue Mission in 1972. It is an honor to circle back with the family to serve the community in this capacity. (Below is a plaque seen at LCGRM).
